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THE SYNOD & LAUDATO SI' ACTION PLATFORM

In the spirit of *co-responsibility* with the clergy: "At this stage in history, work in the light of the Church's social teaching to become a laboratory of "globalization of solidarity and charity", in order to grow with the entire Church in the co-responsibility of offering a future of hope to humanity, by having the courage to make even demanding proposals." There is a Canadian group that is, among other things, promoting and monitoring <u>the synod</u> <u>listening phase</u> that should be taking place in every diocese - <u>Concerned Lay Catholics</u> - which informs us that the synod listening period has been extended; the CCCB has until 15 August 2022. <u>Read more at Andrew's Blog #9</u>

COP26 failures no obstacle to real climate action

Disappointment and even anger at the end of the Glasgow climate summit is not the end of hope for Catholic climate action, said **Laudato Si' Movement - Canada** co-ordinator Agnes Richard. "Hearing the news of missed opportunities for solid targets to phase out not only coal, but also oil and gas, is hugely disappointing," said Richard.

For example, Dr. Carmody Grey, (Catholic Theologian, Durham University (at the 25 min 45 sec mark to 26:34) says, "Narratives of hopelessness don't inspire action. Narratives of hopelessness instill fatigue and cynicism. Hope is a spring of action. The Church is a sort of specialist in hope. ... Our faith is founded on such a moment ... the life and death and ultimately the resurrection of Jesus."


OFS Rule

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the presence of the divine seed in everyone and in the transforming power of love and pardon.


Messengers of perfect joy in every circumstance, **they should strive to bring joy and hope to others.**
