Community Discernment

As we begin a new chapter in the life of our local fraternity, we enter into a period of discernment around our individual and collective gifts as a fraternity, recognizing that our gifts are given to be of service to others. So, we now take time to discern the gifts that we have and the gifts that the fraternity needs. This period of discernment helps us connect our vocation of service to the needs of the fraternity. In this regard, we may wish to reflect on the words of Henri Nouwen ...

Christian discernment is not the same as decision making. Reaching a

decision can be straightforward: we consider our goals and options; maybe we list the pros and cons of each possible choice; and then we choose the action that meets our goal most effectively. Discernment, on the other hand, is about listening and responding to that place within us where our deepest desires align with God's desire. As discerning people, we sift through our impulses, motives, and options to discover which ones lead us closer to divine love and compassion for ourselves and other people and which ones lead us further away. Discernment reveals new priorities, directions, and gifts from God. We come to realize that what previously seemed so important for our lives loses its power over us. Our desire to be successful, well liked and influential becomes increasingly less important as we move closer to God's heart. To our surprise, we even may experience a strange inner freedom to follow a new call or direction as previous concerns move into the background of our consciousness. We begin to see the beauty of the small and hidden life that Jesus lived in Nazareth. Most rewarding of all is the discovery that, as we pray more each day, God's will—that is, God's concrete ways of loving us and our world—gradually is made known to us.

Every minute, 31 people are forced to flee their homes. **Forced migrants** are those compelled to flee their homes because they are in a situation of insecurity and fear for their lives. There are **69 million** people in the world today who are forced migrants. That is double the population of Canada.

- **40 million** are internally displaced.
- 26 million are refugees.
- **3 million** are asylum seekers.
