This chapter has not been easy to understand. What I noticed with repeated reading was that particular words, phrases or sections began to find a place in me. I let go of my need to fully


understand everything and accept what had meaning for me. I offer this to you as a way of approaching your reading of the rest of the chapter.

Ongoing Formation



Following the May fraternity meeting, small groups met, via Zoom, to further reflect on the topic of spiritual intimacy. The reports of the discussions are truly a testament of the breadth and depth of spirituality demonstrated by members of our fraternities. The discussions reflected the Beatitudes as well as the challenges and rewards of seeing God in our neighbor. The themes of faith, hope and love shone throughout and demonstrated the mutual trust shared by all the groups.

There were recurring references to the Rule and Constitutions. Individuals and groups are comfortable in the use and application of both. This speaks in a very positive way of the future health of the fraternities. Excerpts from small group discussions:

- "It's about the depth of our relationship with God. We are challenged to have a love affair even for the long haul. We need more and more 'down time' to carry out our ministry; Jesus would rest after his public appearances."
- "Sister Gemma points it out well! I must carry out the aspects of trusting, forgiving, surprises, disappointments, pain, be non-judgmental which is the messiness of life. It's the every day 'grind' where I encounter the living and active person of Christ."
- "The Beatitudes are a reflection of a love story, calling one's heart to grow in love for others...my spiritual journey has entailed by growing more and more in love with God... (Article #5 evokes this call to love)."
- "Jesus, the gift of his Father's love, chose to become human to better relate to us, thereby showing us the way, through him, to have an intimate connection with God."
- "Daily conversion...how is God working in me?... calling me to be more Christ-like...to be one with God...to let God work in us...we are an extension of God."
- ...importance of trust in community and fraternity. Trust, so that we can be challenged, by each other and as a group, to become the person God wants us to become ...challenged in a positive, holistic, brother and sister style."
- "Appreciation of reference to the connection with the Trinity and the 'flow" from the interior life and the fraternal life, and out into the larger society."

Profession of Nancy Murphy



As was announced during our recent Zoom fraternity meeting, the Council is pleased to announce that we have approved a request for profession from Nancy Murphy who has recently completed her period of Initial Formation. We had hoped that, by mid-June, provincial COVID-19 restrictions on church gatherings would be lifted for a group of the size of our fraternity, and that we could have a face-to-face gathering for Nancy's profession. Unfortunately that is not the case and, as a result, we are unable to hold her temporary profession in June. 50 Things We Have Learned Since The First Earth Day

It is hard to believe, but it was 50 years since the first official Earth Day. On April 22nd, 1970, Wisconsin Senator, Gaylord Nelson declared that it was the time for environmental action that didn't begin and end at collecting litter.

The article below lists some of the things we have learned about our global home during the past 50 years. It is great reading. The following are two examples to consider, as we look forward to collective environmental action the next half-century:

<u>Pollinators</u>; Over the past 50 years, habitat damage has had an enormous impact on pollinators and the native plants that support them. The Canadian Wildlife Federation website has great information on how we can plant native species and educate others. Honibe, an Island honey company, has fostered special bee garden projects across the province. And the PEI Beekeeping Association is also very active in promoting healthy pollinator environments.

<u>Air Quality</u>; We have had marked improvement in air quality in the past 50 years, and ozone levels in the stratosphere are beginning to mend. This is due to many factors, including less smoking, removal of lead from gasoline, and lessening of sulfur dioxide thereby reducing acid deposition. However, carbon dioxide has increased by 25%. Lessons learned from the global pandemic lockdown, which decreased the levels of carbon dioxide, can help us to change our habits, post-pandemic

Due to the COVID restrictions, the venue at which the chapter was to be held (Le Cénacle) is closed for the season and is unable to host the chapter this year. Members of the outgoing Regional Council have agreed to continue serving the region until the elective chapter can be held. During this time, the existing Regional Council will continue to meet on a regular basis and look after the business of the Region as per its ability to do so. Local visits, fraternity elections, etc. will be scheduled as soon as restrictions around travel and gathering are lifted. To ensure continuity in the life of the region, the National Council has confirmed all of the individuals on this council in their exiting positions. Barring more uncertainties, the elective regional chapter will be held on July 30-August 1, 2021 at Le Cénacle in Quebec. Please mark this date on your calendars.

Dear sisters and brothers! Peace and good!

The hours, days and months that we have lived so far have been very difficult, due to the uncertainty of the Pandemic and the rigors of its prevention. Many have lived closely the loss of family and friends; many others have been frustrated by the economic problems that this whole situation has caused. In some way or another, we have suffered, for one another, though always placing everything under the tutelage of the divine mercy.

Let us continue opening channels of hope and charity to those around us, without losing our commitment to being witnesses and instruments of the mission of Christ (R. 6), bearers of peace, messengers of perfect joy (R. 19), and builders of a more fraternal and evangelical world (R. 14).

At this time, we must reinforce the strength and joy represented by the sense of fraternity.

The Holy Spirit has no limits to helping us discover our own creativity, especially in strengthening fraternal ties.
